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I hope you are looking forward to fun times with family and friends over Winter Break! November's Future Ready Skill was Responsible Decision Maker. Below are the learning targets for each grade level. This is a progression, each grade level may add one or two, but also includes the ones from the prior grade level.

Kindergarten

I can identify safe, responsible and respectful choices.

1st Grade

• I can think about (brainstorm) all of the choices I could make.

2nd Grade

• I can think about my choices and how they may affect me or others.

3rd Grade

• I can choose the best option, take action, and communicate my choice.

4th Grade

• I can accept responsibility and the consequences of my choices.

5th Grade

- I can reflect and evaluate the results of my choices.
- I can make safe, responsible, and respectful choices.

Students are also learning about their thinking and feeling parts of their brains, the Pre-Frontal Cortex (PFC or Wise Owl), the Amygdala (Guard Dog), and the Hippocampus (Memory Saver represented by an elephant). They are also learning calm-down strategies to use when an emotion gets too big and their Amygdala (Guard Dog) takes over and they Flip Their Lid, or in other words, speak or act without thinking. Students also learned how gratitude can help us be mindful and can wire our brain to be more positive.

December's Future Ready Skill is Quality Producer

Kindergarten

- I can choose and use appropriate tools to complete my work.
- I can identify steps to do my best work.

Students learned about symmetry and drew half of a butterfly to complete a drawing.

1st Grade

I can pay attention to details in my work.

Students created art using their names in a grid with all uppercase letters and created a color pattern using at lease two colors in each square.

2nd Grade

I can be creative and original in my work.

Students used the eye of a scientist and drew and colored a picture of a swallowtail butterfly by studying a photograph.

3rd Grade

• I can identify ways to improve my work.

Students colored a detailed bookmark of their choice using a variety of mediums.

4th Grade

I can make a plan to meet a goal.

Students created a snowflake with their first names. It took a lot of focus and attention to details. **5th Grade**

• I can use criteria, self-reflection, and feedback from others to meet my goal and improve my work. Students created a nameplate in the style of Romero Britto.

January's Future Ready Skill is Effective Communicator. February's Future Ready Skill is Collaborative Teammate. Students will also be learning about identifying emotions and how to calm big and/or uncomfortable emotions when they arise.

I hope you have a wonderful holiday season and I look forward to continuing to build your child's confidence in their Social/Emotional and Future Ready Skills.
