Coding and Robotics News!

Greetings otter families! Here's what's happening in coding and robotics:

Kindergarten - Students are creating short animations using Scratch Jr. They are learning to write programs with blocks to change how their character looks and move to different points on the screen.

First Grade – Students are practicing coding multiple characters that interact on Scratch Jr. We also learned how to add pages to an animation. Students are getting ready to begin creating a story with multiple pages and characters that interact.

Second Grade – Second graders are getting ready to code their own game with multiple levels and obstacles using Scratch Jr. So far, we have learned how to use the send/receive start messages for multiple characters. We coded a soccer game where students created arrow buttons on the screen to tap and move the soccer ball.

Third grade – We are finishing up coding our own version of Crossy Road using the Hopscotch coding app. Students created this interactive game by learning to code direction buttons on the screen to get their hero across the road, while avoiding obstacles.

Fourth grade is learning how to add sprites, change backgrounds, add sounds, make characters fly, glide, and talk using Scratch. We are getting ready to code an interactive game.


Fifth graders so far have completed 2 robotic builds using the Lego Spike Prime kits. The first robotic unit explores the Engineering Design Process. We practiced identifying a problem by building a robotic dog that reacts to different colors and produces sounds. Students then moved on to practicing building prototypes by creating different types of legs for a "frog hopper." Students were trying to build legs and modify the code to make their frog hopper faster. Here are pictures of some of the frog hoppers:
